
JAST and Teikyo Heisei University Hold Information Sharing Meeting

Japan System Techniques Co., Ltd. (Head Office: Kita-ku, Osaka; Representative: Taku Hirabayashi; President and CEO; JAST) and Teikyo Heisei University (Location: Toshima-ku, Tokyo; President: Hiroko Okinaga) held a meeting for the purpose of sharing information and opinions concerning the GAKUEN Series, which is a strategic university management system and the main product of JAST's GAKUEN business. Teikyo Heisei University uses the GAKUEN Series for many purposes.



■ About Information Sharing Meeting

The information sharing meeting with Teikyo Heisei University, which is a user of the GAKUEN Series, took place in June 2025. The university has established six categories of strengths as the goals for the capabilities students should acquire. In addition, each strength consists of specific attributes, resulting in a total of 25 attributes as shown in the diagram below.



At the meeting, people from JAST and Teikyo Heisei University talked about activities and policies at universities in order to give students the skills to become responsible members of society. The characteristics that companies seek when hiring people were another topic. Discussions used the perspectives of other companies and JAST, which has many years of experience working with academic institutions. Teikyo Heisei University participants included the deputy president, leaders of academic faculties and departments, the Education Management Office, the Employment Support



Office, and the Administration Group. JAST was represented by members of the Personnel Department, which is responsible for hiring new graduates, and the Educational Division, which oversees the GAKUEN business in eastern Japan.

Major discussion topics

- 1. Process for admitting new students
- 2. Academic progress and achievements
- 3. Job hunting activities and internships
- 4. Basic policy and plan for upgrading research capabilities

■ Accomplishments and upcoming activities

This was the second meeting held by JAST to share information and opinions with a university using the GAKUEN series following the first meeting in 2024. The meetings give JAST valuable information about the goals of universities and their current operations. Discussions cover the current climate for universities as well as activities concerning diploma supplements to enable students to use them for job hunting activities. Participants also talked about the importance of internships to enable students to learn more about companies, the need to promote the hiring of people with specialized skills, and other subjects. These meetings give JAST a better understanding of universities and an opportunity to explain to university personnel the types of people that companies want and their recruiting policies and goals.

JAST plans to continue holding meetings with universities for the purpose of facilitating recruiting activities that reflect the current environment for universities.
